The above standatone financial results have been reviewed by the Audit Committee and approved by the Board of Directors in its meeting neld on June 29, 2020 and Audited by the Statutory Auditor of the Company

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- In March 2020, the World Health Organisation declared Coronavirus (COVID-19) to be a pandemic and consequently on March 24, 2020, the Government of In Match 2020, the world Freshir organisation declared Coronaviris (COVID-19) to be a partitering and consequently on Match 24, 2020, the Government or India Ordered a nationwide lockdown, which got extended in phases. The outbreak of COVID-19 pandemic in India has caused significant instructions and slowdown of economic activities. The Company's business operations have been significantly impacted by way of interruption of production supply chain, etc. The company will continue to closely monitor the situation and any material changes to future economic conditions. During May 2020, the company has resumed its business activities in a phased manner in line with directives issued by the central and state government.
- These standatore financial results are prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles of Indian Accounting Standards as notified under the Companies (Indian Accounting Stantiards) Rules, 2015 as specified in Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013.

The Company has measured the lease fability at present value of remaining lease payments discounted using the incremental borrowing rate as the date of initial application and Right of Use asset is measured at an amount equal to lease liability, adjusted by the amount of any prepaid or accrued lease payments relating to that lease recognized in the balance sheet immediately before the date of initial application.
- In line with the provisions of Ind AS 108 Operating Segments and on the basis the review of operations being done by the senior management, the operations of the Company fall under Auto Components & Parts business, which is considered to be the only reportable segment by the management
- During the quarter and year ended 31 March 2020, the Company opted for Sabka Vishwas (Legacy Dispute Resolution) Scheme to settle an ongoing legal dispute with the Central Excise department for which the appeal was pending at CESTAT level. The Company has paid a total amount of INR 213.80 lakks (including INR 80 lakks paid under protest, in earlier years), impact of the same has been disclosed under the head of Exceptional Items.

The Statement include the financial results for the quarter ended 31st March, 2020 being the balancing figure between the audited figures in respect of the full financial year and the published unaudited year to date figures up to the third quarter of the current financial year which were subject to limited review by us.

#### Note

- 1 The above consolidated financial results have been reviewed by the Audit Committee and approved by the Board of Directors in its meeting held on June 29, 2020 and Audited by the Statutory Auditors-of the Company
- 2 In March 2020, the World Health Organisation declared Coronavirus (CCVID-19) to be a pandemic and consequently on March 24, 2020, the Government of India Ordered a nationwide lockdown, which got extended in phases. The outbreak of COVID-19 pandemic in India has caused significantly disturbance and slowdown of according activities. The Group's business operations have been significantly impacted by way of interruption of production, supply chain, etc. The Group will continue to closely monitor the situation and any material changes to future economic conditions. During May 2020, the group has resumed its business ectivities in a phased mariner in line with directives issued by the central and state government.
- 3 Taibros Automotive Components Limited (the Company') and its joint ventures are together referred as 'the Group' in the following notes. These consolidated financial results are prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles of Indian Accounting Standards as notified under the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015 as specified in Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013.
- 4 Effective 1 April 2019, the Group adopted Ind AS 116 "Leases", applied to all contracts having lease components existing on 1 April 2019 using the modified retrospective method. Accordingly, the Group has not restated comparative information. The Group has measured the lease liability at present value of remaining lease payments discounted using the incremental borrowing rate as the date of initial application and Right of Use asset is measured at an amount equal to lease liability, adjusted by the amount of any prepaid or accrued lease payments relating to that lease recognized in the batance sheet immediately before the date of initial application.
- 5 In line with the provisions of Ind AS 108 Operating Segments and on the basis the review of operations being done by the senior management, the operations of the Group fall under Auto Components & Parts business, which is considered to be the only reportable segment by the management
- During the quarter and year ended 31 March 2020, the Group opted for Sabka Vishwas (Legacy Dispute Resolution) Scheme to settle an ongoing legal dispute with the Central Excise department for which the appeal was pariding at CESTAT level. The Company has paid a total amount of INR 213.80 Jakhs (including INR 80 lakhs paid under protest, in earlier years), impact of the same has been disclosed under the head of Exceptional Items.
